Before the 2010 general election, David Cameron and George Osborne made a pensioner pledge, which has been delivered in office. Pensioners have benefited from the biggest ever cash rise in the basic State Pension, universal benefits including free bus passes and the Winter Fuel Allowance.

The Conservatives in

Government have also introduced the triple lock pension guarantee which will see the basic State Pension increased, either by price index, earnings or 2.5 per cent annually - whichever is highest. This year the minimum income guarantee was increased by 3.9 per cent to £142.70 a week - protecting those with no other source of income.

Craig Williams told us, "It is important to make sure that older and retired people are treated with dignity and given the quality of life they deserve. I believe these principles should be respected and recognised at all times and I am proud of our record of delivery in Government."

LABOUR HAVE CUT THE NAS IN WALES

LABOUR have cut the health budget in Wales by £534 million - 8.4 per cent of the entire budget - whilst Conservatives in Westminster will have increased investment in the NHS by £12.5 billion per year by 2015.

LABOUR'S harsh cuts to the health budget in Wales are hurting patients:

- More people on waiting lists in Wales. 1 in 8 people in Wales are now on a waiting list of some description, whereas in England it is 1 in 20.
- Waiting times are longer in Wales. The number of patients waiting longer than 6 months have trebled in Wales since May 2010, whereas they have halved in England.
- Fewer patients in Wales can get the drugs they need. Patients in England are five times more likely to have access to vital cancer drugs than those in Wales. There are 24 new cancer drugs that patients can routinely get in England, but not in Wales.
- Cardiff South and Penarth is suffering because of Labour's NHS cuts. Thanks to Labour, patients are waiting longer than 36 weeks to see a specialist here in Cardiff, and the NHS in Wales continues to fall behind England month after month.

GETTING POLICE BACK OUT ON THE BEAT

Slashing bureaucracy and stripping away police targets to help in the fight to cut crime.

nder Labour the police spent more time on paperwork than they did on patrol. This is not what officers signed up for when they joined the service - a system which meant that 70 forms needed to be completed to deal with a simple burglary.

Conservatives in Government are slashing the bureaucracy that the police face. We are stripping away all of Labour's targets and giving the police one simple objective - to cut crime. We have already unveiled a package of policies that will cut police red tape, saving 4.5 million police hours.

By cutting costs and scrapping bureaucracy we are making sure that police officers are taken out of the back office and put back on the beat, supporting local communities and cutting crime.

We are introducing Police and Crime Commissioners across Wales to make sure that the police are accountable to local communities. WELSH LABOUR HAVE FAILED THE NEXT GENERATION



ducation is the most important gift we can give our children and it has never been more important to ensure that the next generation are equipped with the skills they need to succeed in the world. Welsh Labour has failed in this vital task.

Labour's failure has resulted in Wales slipping down the international league tables and falling far behind the rest of the UK. Between 2006 and 2009, Wales fell 5 places in reading, 12 places in maths, and 9 places in science.

Labour have said that they don't expect to see 'real improvement' the next time school systems are

ranked - but this simply is not good enough.

According to recent comparable figures, Welsh councils are spending an average of £604 less per pupil than councils in England. Once again, Wales loses out.

Craig Williams said, "Labour's shameful record on education is a national disgrace. Students across Wales are being put at a disadvantage, purely because of where they live.

"Several local authorities are failing to achieve basic standards in education and I for one find this deeply concerning".

SHOULD THE SEVERNBEUSED TO HARNESS TO TIDAL ENERGY?

The proposed Severn Barrage project will potentially see the estuary of the River Severn used to generate tidal energy.

It will involve an enormous building project crossing the Severn allowing power to be harnessed from the force of the tidal flow. The huge 14 metre tidal range of the Severn Estuary - one of the highest in the world - represents a renewable, predictable resource with the potential to generate up to 5 per cent of the UK's electricity needs.

There is a significant potential to make an important contribution to the UK's renewable energy targets.
